This course, Certified Phlebotomy Technician I, prepares students for entry level employment as phlebotomists in hospitals, clinics, blood banks and other healthcare settings. Participants must be actively participating in one of the following at the time of registration and have documentation: currently working in a related field, have previous education or have an active certification/license in the medical occupational area.

Instruction includes:

- Developing skills in performing phlebotomy procedures during on-campus training followed by an externship.
- Venipuncture techniques, specimen processing, and non-blood specimens.
- Assigned designated clinical externship will be included as part of the required training.

Admission Requirements

- Must be 18 years or older at time of registration.
- Documentation of previous education, certification/licensure in health occupation, or employed in a related field.
- Proof of high school diploma or equivalent.
- Current government-issued photo ID.
- Social Security card.
- Health clearance documents deadline (TB test, Hepatitis B Vaccine, MMR Vaccine, Chicken Pox Vaccine, T-dap, and Flu Vaccine): 1st week of class.
- Current CPR card: must read “Health Care Provider” and be valid through the duration of the Phlebotomy course.

Program Requirements

- Maintain a minimum 76% grade average and a 93% attendance rate.
- Externship included in program.
- Fingerprinting and background check may be required.

- Textbooks.
- Two uniform sets and one lab coat.
